TOCYNNAU A PHASIAU · TICKETS AND PASSES

Immediately, upon receipt of tickets and passes, exhibitors are requested to check that the allocation is correct. **No duplicate tickets or passes will be issued during the Show period free of charge.**

NAMED ONE-DAY Wristbands will be issued to horse exhibitors.

i) **Exhibitor refunds and declaration of non-attendance Refunds in exceptional circumstances.** The Society will only issue a refund after 10 June 2026 in extreme exceptional circumstances, such as government restrictions, serious illness or death. Any such refund would be subject to all tickets and passes being returned to the Livestock Office no later than 15 July 2026, with a receipt as proof of return. Those who post their tickets must do so by recorded delivery, with the proof of postage retained.

Any exhibitor who is unable to attend the event must inform the Society in writing by 10 June 2026, a partial refund will then be issued. After this date, although no refund will be issued, exhibitors must still inform the Livestock Office of their absence in writing. Any tickets and passes received must be returned, unused, directly to the Livestock Office by 15 July 2026, with a receipt as proof of return.

Failure by any exhibitor to notify the Society of their absence in writing and return any tickets or passes received may result in action being taken against that exhibitor. Under the terms of the Society's Disciplinary Procedure, any exhibitor who is found to have breached the Society's rules may be barred from exhibiting at future shows for a period of time.

ii) **If unable to compete during the event, due to animal injury.**

Any exhibitor whose animal becomes injured whilst on the Showground and is unable to compete in its class, must be certified by one of the Society's vets. The Vets certificate **MUST** then be supplied to the Livestock Office. Failure to adhere to these procedures may result in disciplinary action being taken as per above.

PEBYLL · TENTS

An exhibitor may purchase a tent pass for £100.00. Both Livestock and Horse exhibitors tents will be situated in Upper North 12. Tents will be allocated on a first come, first serve basis. Please note that tents can only be erected in the authorised area in Upper North 12. The Society will not be held responsible for any accidents to person/s erecting tents in unauthorised areas, and any tents not erected in Upper North 12 will be removed by the security. Please note that the Society considers a **trailer tent** to be the same as a caravan, and as such anyone wishing to bring a **trailer tent** to the Show **MUST** book a caravan plot on their entry form (Please refer to caravan booking for prices).

Exhibitors please be aware that due to demand, not all requests may be accommodated, but alternatives will be offered in this instance. Please note that a camper van is considered the same as a caravan by the Society and, therefore, a caravan pass should be ordered if you intend to bring a camper van to the Show. With Health and Safety/Fire Regulations having to be rigorously administered, exhibitors **MUST** state on their entry form if their vehicle will be used for accommodation during the Show. There will not be a fee for exhibitors using their vehicles for accommodation. Exhibitors are restricted to **one caravan** plot only **per address**. Exhibitors must have completed the 'expression of interest' application for via ³their RWAS online account to be eligible to be placed in to

the Ballot for a caravan plot.

To ensure compliance with Fire Safety Regulations, all caravans will be required to be spaced six meters between caravan walls and three meters clear between associated equipment (e.g., Car or awning) and the adjacent caravan. All caravans and other vehicles used for accommodation **MUST** carry a suitable fire extinguisher (5-kilo dry powder type). **Equine Exhibitors only – A caravan will not be admitted onto the site via Horse Hill if it is being towed by a lorry.**

Children are always the responsibility of parents and carers whilst on the Showground including the caravan and camping parks. Unaccompanied children under the age of 12 are not admitted to the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society shows and must not be left unaccompanied in a caravan or tent.

While accompanied children are welcome in most caravanning and camping areas at the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society shows the livestock caravan park and camping area (Exhibitors) is not suitable for children under 16.

CYRRAEDD · ARRIVAL

All vehicles will be inspected upon arrival.

Exhibits should arrive no later than two hours before the scheduled judging time.

No exhibit/horse exhibitor will be allowed onto the Showground before 12.00 noon, Saturday 18 July 2026. A holding area will be provided from 11.00am Saturday, 18 July 2026.

We advise all exhibitors that they do not arrive prior to 11.00am, Saturday 18 July 2026.

All exhibits may be subject to veterinary inspections.

All vehicles will be inspected upon arrival. Any vehicle displaying a “vehicle towing horses” pass and not carrying horses shall be turned away from the Showground.

Horse exhibitors showing for one or two days will receive day vehicle passes for the day(s) concerned only. Such passes are valid from 6.00pm on the night prior to showing until 7.00pm on the day of showing.

Any exhibitor bringing imported equines to the Show, or who shall be exporting any equines exhibited at the Show after the event are required to contact the Animal Health Office prior to the show. (Tel: 01228 403 600)

RHEOLIADAU ADNABOD CEFFYLAU (CYMRU) 2018 · THE EQUINE IDENTIFICATION

Horse passports must be with the horse and available for inspection as required by the Trading Standards Officer and Society Officials.

FFLIW CEFFYLAU · EQUINE INFLUENZA

Following advice from animal health professionals and the prevalence of the Equine Flu in the summer of 2019, the Society Officials have made the decision to allow only horses vaccinated against Equine Flu to attend the 2026 Royal Welsh Show.

Equine entries **MUST HAVE** an up-to-date equine influenza vaccination record. They must have received two primary vaccinations which are given not less than 21 days and not more than 60 days apart.

If sufficient time has elapsed the equine entry must also have received a booster vaccination which is given not less than 120 days and not more than 180 days after the second component of the primary vaccination, and further booster vaccinations at intervals of not more than a year apart.

None of the vaccinations must have been given on the day of entry to the showground or on any of the six days before entry to the showground.

Note: **Minimum requirements are the two primary vaccinations, plus seven days before entry to the showground. Foals born during the year of the Royal Welsh Show are given special dispensation to enter the show i.e., all foals born in 2026 will not require vaccination.**

GWASANAETH MIL-FEDDYGOL · VETERINARY SERVICE

Will be available on the Showground from **12noon**, Saturday 18 July. After 7.00pm, contact should be made via the veterinary compound as marked on show plan. All inspections will be made free of charge. However, any scanning or treatment will be charged for.

All prize money will be the responsibility of the owed competitor to claim. The process of claiming prize money will be via your RWAS account. You will receive an explanatory email of how to claim your prize money when available to claim, unless an exhibitor has specifically requested otherwise. When processed and approved, in accordance with the terms of the Society's Rules & Regulations, payments for prizes awarded at the RWAS, where there is no dispute, will be made not later than one month after the Event. Any outstanding amounts due to the Society may be set-off against any prize money or other amount owed to the exhibitor.

If entries are withdrawn in writing prior to Wednesday, 10 June a refund shall be issued. Please note, for those classes that carry a HOYS Qualifier, the HOYS contribution fee of £20.00 cannot be refunded.

As a condition of entry to the Show, all exhibitors must have Public and Products Liability Insurance cover for a minimum of £2,000,000. Proof of cover is to be provided at entry.

Under the terms of the Society's Disciplinary Procedure, any exhibitor who is found to have breached the Society's rules may be barred from exhibiting at future shows for a period of time.

A fee of £45.00 for Members and £55.00 for Non-Members will be charged per stable, per night. As stables are limited, not all exhibitors can be accommodated. Exhibitors will be informed accordingly. Stables are allocated on a first come, first served basis. Exhibits must be stabled in the box allocated. All stables must be vacated by 5.00 pm daily to enable them to be prepared in readiness for the next day's exhibitors. However, the next day's exhibitors will not be allowed to enter the stables until 7.30 pm daily. For example, if an exhibitor was showing on Tuesday, they would require a Monday stable which would accommodate the equine from 7.30 pm Monday until 5.00 pm Tuesday.

Exhibitors should note that there are only a limited number of appropriate stallion stables available, so not all requests for stallion stables can be accommodated. Exhibitors should mark on their entry form or submit a request with their entries if they require a stallion stable.

Stables are to be used for equines only. In cases of emergency, the Society will not be held responsible for the equines if they have to be let out of their stables.

Stables are not transferable between exhibitors. Any exhibitor proven to have sold their stable or to have used stables that have not been booked, paid for or allocated to them, will be referred to the Society's Disciplinary Panel. The Society reserves the right to re-allocate stables at its discretion. Stable fees may be refunded if cancelled, in writing and received before Wednesday 10 June 2026. No stable fees will be refunded after this date.

Any horse that qualifies for the Ridden; In-Hand (Thursday 23 July 2026); or the Driving Championship (Wednesday 22 July 2026) may, at the discretion of the Assistant Honorary Director of Horses, receive a stable free of charge for the night(s) required. The Exhibitor **MUST** gain a permission slip from the Assistant Honorary Director of Horses in the Main Ring Control Tower once they have qualified for the Championships, and supply this to the Society's Horse Foreman in order to gain their stable.

Please note that equines will not be permitted access or exit from the stabling area between 12.00 midnight and 6.00am each night.

AELODAETH · MEMBERSHIP

To qualify to enter at members' rates, exhibitors must be **fully paid up** members of the Royal Welsh Agricultural Society Ltd **UPON ENTRY**. Please check that your RWAS account shows your membership status before adding any entries/items to your basket. If items/entries are added to your basket with incorrect membership status you **WILL** be charged the non-member rate. **Refunds will not be given**.

SAFON GWISG · STANDARD OF DRESS

Please note that any judges, stewards, exhibitors or grooms deemed to be inappropriately attired will be prohibited from entering the Show rings (Males should wear a shirt and tie and females should be classically dressed). No reference to stud names etc should be visible on any clothing. No refund will be issued to any exhibitor who is unable to compete due to being turned away for poor attire.

When mounted anyone riding an equine anywhere on the Showground must wear a hat to British Standard specification appropriate to the relevant Section/Society in which they are exhibiting/competing at all times when mounted.

TYWYSWYR · HANDLERS

All handlers must be a minimum of **14 years old** on the first day of the Show for the judging of all the In-hand horse classes and to lead a horse/pony down the horsewalk and for the Main Ring parades.

All persons leading a horse into the ring must walk and not trot or gallop; failure to comply with this rule will result in your exhibit being disqualified from judging.

MARCHOGION · RIDERS

The Society is keen to promote Equine Welfare and as part of this we encourage all riders, no matter where they are on the Showground, to be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden.

CWYMP · FALL

A Fall from either a rider or a horse in any showing section constitutes elimination.

GORYMDAITH Y PRIF GYLCH · MAIN RING PARADE

The first three prize winners in each class **MUST** parade as shown below; other prize winners have the option to parade. Any exhibitor who ignores this rule will **FORFEIT his/her prize money**. Exhibitors **MUST** hand in their parade card to the designated steward when lined up in the parade. All handlers must be a minimum of 14 years old on the first day of the Show for the Main Ring parades.

If any exhibitor feels they have a valid reason to be excused from the parade, they **MUST** complete a pro- forma in the Main Ring Control Tower, outlining their reason for not parading. The Assistant Honorary Director - Horses, Mr Chris Davies, will then approve or decline the exhibitors request following the Show.

The entry fee to the American Miniature Horse classes will include an additional Horse of the Year Show contribution of £20.00.

Exhibitors, owners, and handlers must be current members of the UKAMHS. All competitors must have filled out a showing declaration form and paid the appropriate UKAMHS 2026 Showing Levy Fee. All horses must be nominated with UKAMHS

All exhibits must be registered with the American Miniature Horse Association (AMHA), the American Miniature Horse Registry (AMHR), or the AMHCGB Studbook (Section A/Purebred). Horses must measure appropriately for their age and cannot exceed 34 inches in height. Exhibits must have been measured at a UKAMHS approved measuring clinic or show prior to entering a qualifier.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependent on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

This class will be divided into four sections as follows:
